### THE LASTING LEGACY OF NUREMBERG – THE EVOLUTION OF INTER- NATIONAL CRIMINAL LAW AND DETERRENCE

Benjamin Berell Ferencz (born March 11, 1920) was an investigator after World War II and the Chief Prosecutor for the US Army at the well-known "Einsatzgruppen Trial", one of twelve subsequent trials after Nuremberg held by US authorities in their occupation zone.

On Tuesday, 26th November 2013, Professor Ferencz will speak about his active role advocating for the establishment of an International Criminal Law Court. He will address the evolution of international criminal law, before coming to the pertinent question of deterrence: Can national and international courts, through criminalizing illegal war-making and holding leaders accountable, effectively deter the commission of future core crimes, such as crimes against humanity?
