Accommodation

Arriving by car

In Rauischholzhausen the way to the castle is signposted. There is a lower and upper access to the castle, each ending at a parking lot. The upper parking lot can accommodate about 50 cars, the lower about 10; Additional parking is available in the surrounding streets. From both parking lots it is only a few steps to the castle. Arriving by train and public transport

Rauischholzhausen Castle is only difficult to reach by train or by public transport - traveling by car is much easier. The nearest DB station is Marburg Hbf, which is located on the DB main line Frankfurt-Gießen-Kassel and is approached every hour by local, RE and IC trains. Further details can be found in the timetable information of Deutsche Bahn. According to the timetable information of the Deutsche Bahn, bus line 75 departs from Marburg (Lahn) to Rauischholzhausen. Departure 11:20, 13:32, 16:34 and 18:20 from the central bus station in Marburg; Arrival in Rauischholzhausen (Potsdamer Straße) about 30 minutes later.
