Liebig Garten functions as a demonstration garden for teaching, learning and knowledge-transfer purposes, as well as for spreading information about biodiversity. Events with a similar topics can also take place there.

Students and other university members on a voluntary basis are planting, for example, some historical fruit tree species.

Biodiversity is demonstrated through some flower meadows.

This garden should also serve as a relaxing corner.

Lastly, students are creating an urban gardening project, “Krumme Möhre” (“Crooked carrot”) in the area to explore and practice various possibilities of organic farming and local food systems.

The garden should contribute to sustainable development at the university, including interdisciplinary collaboration, student self-organisation and knowledge transfer.

The second goal of sustainable development (“Zero Hunger”) is addressed in this project through the practice of sustainable agriculture.

The urban gardening project contributes to the 11th goal (“Sustainable cities and communities”) as well as to responsible consumption and production (the 12th goal of sustainable development).

One of the key ideas shown through this gardening project is the retention of biodiversity which is a perfect example of the 15th goal of sustainable development (“Life on land”).
