

Teacher Education and Educational Sciences at Stockholm University

Around 30 000 students at Stockholm University including approximately 5 000 Teacher Education students.
Six different departments involved in teacher education

Teacher education programs for all school levels: from Early Childhood Education to Teacher Education Programs for Secondary School and Upper Secondary School.

Also freestanding/single subject field courses, bachelor and master programs in Educational Sciences.



Semesters

- Autumn semesters are starting mid August until mid January
- Spring semesters are starting mid January until beginning of June

- A semester consists 30 of ECTS (one week is 1,5 credits)
- Many courses are 7,5 ECTS with an exam directly at the end
- Make up exams vary depending on the course, but most are some weeks later or right before the new semester starts

Teachers' programmes

- Preschool teacher (1 year olds-5 years olds)
- Preschool class (6 years old) – 3rd grade
- Compulsary school 4th-6th grade

- Compulsary school 7th-9th grade
- Upper secondary school

Teachers' programme

- To become a teacher you have to study a teacher's programme which is between 4 and 5 years depending on age group and subjects studied.
- There is also a possibility to study a complementary teachers programme if you have enough studies in your subject.
- Within the programme the students do internships on three occasions, with pre- and post seminars, visits from professors.

Teacher's certificate

- Once you have your teacher's degree you need to apply for a teacher's certificate at the Swedish National Agency for Education
- Without a certificate you cannot be employed for more than a year as a substitute teacher.
- A teacher who continues their studies after their diploma can add on subjects to their certificate.

Studying science of religion in Sweden

- Science of religion I: Islam, Judaism, Christianity, Hinduism, Buddhism, Daoism and Shinto. Also ancient religions from Greece, Rome and the old North. Introduction to religious history theories, methods and concepts, and research history.
- Science of religion II: Deepening knowledge of the world religions, focusing on living with the religion. Studying the central texts and how they have been interpreted during history until today. How religious theory has been developing.

Studying science of religion in Sweden

- Science of religion III: Overview of the newer Western religions and the alternative religions development in regard to the rest of the world. Includes a research project of 15 ECTS.
- Science of religion IV: Wider knowledge of history of religion's methodics and theory building, as well as didactics of religious questions. Includes a research project of 15 ECTS.


