As an alternative: "Art and Music" for English speaking students: The seminar with term paper is replaced by a stage project of the course offer of Applied Theater Science or an individual artistic achievement. The stage project or the individual artistic achievement should have a music-theatrical relevant focus (e.g. scenic concerts; radio play; composition) or show a relevant topical focus in Arts (e.g. visual representation; theory of images, installation art, body art.
