Many business courses require Marketing as a prerequisite.

UPPER-YEAR COURSES with pre-requisites are not open to visiting exchange students unless the student obtains approval from Saint Mary's academic advisor of the subject area ahead of time. Our academic advisor uses the student's home university transcript to assess their academic background. Not all pre-requisite override requests may be approved.

Not all times courses students want to choose may be available; thus, we do not recommend our exchange program to students who have a specific set of courses they must complete during the exchange program.

Courses for the upcoming academic year are published online usually in March. In the meantime, you can go to their <u>website</u> and follow the prompts on the page to see the courses offered in the current year:

- At "Select a term", choose "September-December 2023" or "January-April 2024" from the dropdown menu and press "continue".
- At "Enter Your Search Criteria", choose:
- "Undergraduate" for "Academic Level";
- the subject area of interest for "Course Subject";
- "Main" for "Campus" and press "Search".

To look up course descriptions, check the <u>Undergraduate course catalog</u>. Use this catalogue only to search for course descriptions; not all courses on the catalogue are offered every semester!

For information purposes, you can look up their <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u> ("FAQ") page to understand how the courses are organized and numbered.

Students must take a minimum of 3 courses (9cr) to a maximum of 5 courses (15cr) per semester to be a full-time student.
