DORMS:

- 2500 € for the whole semester
- covers rent, utilities and services, and a bedding pack as well as 10 laundry tokens (limited number of rooms, early application recommended)
Household/kitchen/bathroom utensils/supplies for the on-campus accommodation

PRIVATE:

- single room with a double bed and an ensuite bathroom, shared kitchen: 180 € per week (~ 720 € per month)

- Shared Flat: 590 € /month
