Language Requirements

TUITION: ERASMUS scholarship > no tuition fees

Accommodation

PRIVATE:

- shared apartment with one other student: 550 € per month
 - o all-inclusive, also internet
- Private student accommodation called Hatch: 1100 € per month plus deposit of 500 €
- Private student housing called Yugo: 1000 € per month
 - all-inclusive, also internet, on-site gym, use of common areas and maintenance works
 - Not included: Laundry 8€ per washing and drying
- Room in a shared house via Eazy City: 680 € per month
 - o all-inclusive, also internet
 - o 130 € booking fee for accommodation via Eazy City plus 200 € deposit

DORMS:

- Hatch Student Living: 780 €/month
 - o rent covers the room, private bathroom, kitchen, all utensils etc. and the usage of the common areas in the main building (TV, study room, terrace). Water and electricity are included but it is possible that you may have to pay extra at the end of your stay if you went over the calculated price
 - o not included: washer/dryer; 2.50€
 - found via the accommodation website of the UCC

NOTE: Cork is suffering from a housing crisis and the university does not have enough accomodation for international students. Accomodation is hard to come by, to get student accomodation students should apply as soon as possible. The university warns of scams on websites like daft.ie and facebook, so people looking for housing should be careful. Another resource for housing is https://hostingpower.ie/ which gives students a room with host families, but most of them are further away from the centre.

Other Costs

Public Transport: 1.90 € per ticket. Students recommend to apply for the "Leap Card" which allows you to take public transport for 0.65 € per ticket.
