Justus Liebig University

Justus Liebig University Giessen (JLU) is one of the oldest universities in the federal state of Hesse and attracts today some 25,000 students. Its 11 faculties and 8 research centres offer a wide range of courses of study. Human and veterinary medicine, agricultural sciences and domestic and nutritional sciences combine to give the JLU a constellation of subjects in the area of human life, nutrition and environment that is unique in Germany. In addition, it offers the full range of natural sciences, legal and business studies, social and educational sciences, and language and cultural studies – an exceptionally broad teaching and research spectrum. Students can choose from around 150 different programmes.

The Faculty 09

In the Faculty 09 Agricultural Sciences, Nutritional Sciences and Environmental Management agriculture and nutrition have a long tradition at Justus Liebig University Giessen. Safeguarding the worldwide food supply as well as a healthy nutrition are the focus of research and teaching of all disciplines in our faculty. The broad range of topics and issues goes from primary production to food processing on to the development of environment-friendly land use systems and biogeochemical cycles, all discussed and examined from a scientific and economic point of view. The Faculty 09 has approximately 3,000 students spread across 24 degree programmes. Eight of these are taught entirely in English. The Faculty 09 comprises 45 chairs. Each chair is a teaching and research unit overseen by a professor.

MODULES

WHAT IS A MODULE IN THE FACULTY 09?

Definition

Modules are defined as teaching units or courses that run over one semester and are completed with an examination. Each module is assigned to either the winter or summer semester offered on a regular basis and has 6 CPS. Changes of the module catalogue are always announced by the team of the study deanery by mail for the following semester at the end of a semester. All documents on the Faculty 09 webpages are updated at the end of each semester.

Block Modules

There are also modules offered during the lecture free period known as Block Modules as they take place within a certain period of time, e.g. two weeks.

An overview of all modules is published in the updated timetable each semester.

TWO TYPES OF MODULES IN OUR FACULTY 09: CORE MODULES AND PROFILE MODULES

CORE MODULES

Mandatory Modules

Core modules are mandatory in a degree programme and have to be completed successfully. In all modules students have three exam attempts to successfully complete the module. Please note that a failure of all three attempts in one core module leads to the exmatriculation from the entire degree programme. In case of certified illness students are excused from the attempt.

PROFILE MODULES

Shaping your Profile

Profile modules can be chosen from the entire module catalogue of the Faculty 09. However, we have created separate module directories for each degree programme to make orientation easier. If you seek further advice on the choice of profile modules, please do not hesitate to contact the degree programme director.

In profile modules students also have three attempts to successfully complete the exam. However, profile modules can be changed after a failed exam. Once successfully completed they cannot be changed anymore.

MODULE CODES

Labelling modules

All Faculty 09 modules have a specific module code structure.

BK = Bachelor Core Module (mandatory)
 BP = Bachelor Profile Module (optional)
 EN = Module is taught completely in English
 DI = Module is offered completely digital).

As an example: The module **BK-102-EN – Biology** is a core module in a Bachelor's degree programme taught in English. You need the module code and its title for registration in our electronic system StudIP or for exam registration (FlexNow).

RECOMMENDED DEGREE STRUCTURE

SYSTEMS: STUDIP AND FLEXNOW

STUDIP

*Registration in a
module*

Stud.IP is the university's communication and learning platform. It allows lecturers to share learning material, post announcements for students etc. Students have to register for a seat in a module via Stud.IP. Here you will also find the contact details of the module coordinators and lecturers as well as information on the module content and details of time and place.

Your StudIP account will be activated only from your first login. Therefore, please do this as soon as possible. Until then, you will not be "visible" in StudIP.

FLEXNOW

exam registration

FlexNow is the centralized examination management system of JLU. Students have to register for all module examinations in JLU's FlexNow System.

The exam registration in the Faculty 09 is done towards the end of the semester and each winter semester the study deanery of the faculty 09 offers an online introduction session on the registration procedure. Please note that students can choose between two possible examination periods which can help to distribute the workload for the exams. All dates are published on the faculty 09 webpage as well as announced via email by the study deanery.

STUDY REGULATIONS

start of the winter semester, students who are not officially enrolled at the end of the winter semester can enroll in the international degree programme for their respective Bachelor's degree in Global Food Systems. The green document (green document) is a confirmation of enrollment in the

end of the degree programme. The course system allows an individual course system. Faculty 09 /JLU Giessen provides individual letters on how to organize their studies after their arrival. We will issue individual letters confirming late

arrival. Should a student arrive only in the second half of the winter semester due to a delay, they will commence their degree programme with the modules available in the summer semester.

The examination regulations of the faculty 09 Justus Liebig University does not limit the study period to a certain number of semesters in any degree programme of the faculty 09.

INTRODUCTION DAYS

Welcome Days

From 29 September to 02 October 2026, the Faculty 09 will be offering introductory sessions for the first-semester students. You will be welcomed by staff from the Faculty 09 Study Deanery and provided with all the information you need to get off to a good start on your degree programme. Student mentors will be present to help with your initial module registration. We highly recommend you participate in these days. Here, you'll receive the most important information for your studies, get to know the city together in groups, and meet other students

MENTOR GROUPS

Registration in StudIP

During the introduction days you will be divided into mentor groups. In your mentor group you get to know all you need to know about studying at JLU in the Faculty 09 and how you register for your modules in the first semester. We strongly recommend registration in five modules as indicated in the course structure table for the first semester. As the exam registration in FlexNow has to be done at the end of a semester you can decide at a later point in time whether you really want to complete this module and then decide to register for the exam or not. However, please note that these winter modules will not be offered again until next winter semester.

EXAM REGISTRATION

Information session

At the beginning of the semester, you do not need to worry about examinations yet. You should only take an examination when you feel sufficiently prepared for it. Towards the end of the winter semester just before the first exams are approaching the study deanery will offer an introductory session on the entire exam registration procedure. You will receive an announcement via email from the study deanery. This session usually takes place at the end of January. Further details on the course system are provided in our Late Arrival Brochure, which explains in detail how you can catch up on missed modules.

STILL AT HOME?

FOR STUDENTS STILL ABROAD

Digital Course*

In our English language Bachelor degree programmes B.Sc. Environmental Sciences and B.Sc. Global Food Systems it is possible to begin your studies with a digital course (module) if you are unable to arrive on time, allowing you to make productive use of the time before your arrival.

In the Bachelor's degree programmes B.Sc. Environmental Sciences and B.Sc. Global Food Systems, the module **BK-103-EN Language Acquisition** is a mandatory course.

Students who are required to take a German language course will be offered a **digital German language course** during the upcoming winter semester. Please register for **BK-103-EN** via Stud.IP.

Students holding a German higher education entrance qualification (e.g. the German Abitur), as well as international students who can provide proof of German language proficiency at **CEFR level C1**, may choose any other language course offered by the **Centre for Competence Development (Zentrum für fremdsprachliche und berufsfeldorientierte Kompetenzen – ZfbK)**.

Can I study longer than 6 semesters?

Period of study

Our modules are offered regularly in either the winter or summer semester. Although we recommend a certain schedule, students can decide for themselves when to complete their modules. All required core and profile modules must be successfully completed at some point. The university does not impose a limit on the number of semesters needed for completion. However, international students should be aware that they need to prove progress in their studies to the relevant authorities in order to extend their visa. If you need support with this, please contact the International Office (see contacts).

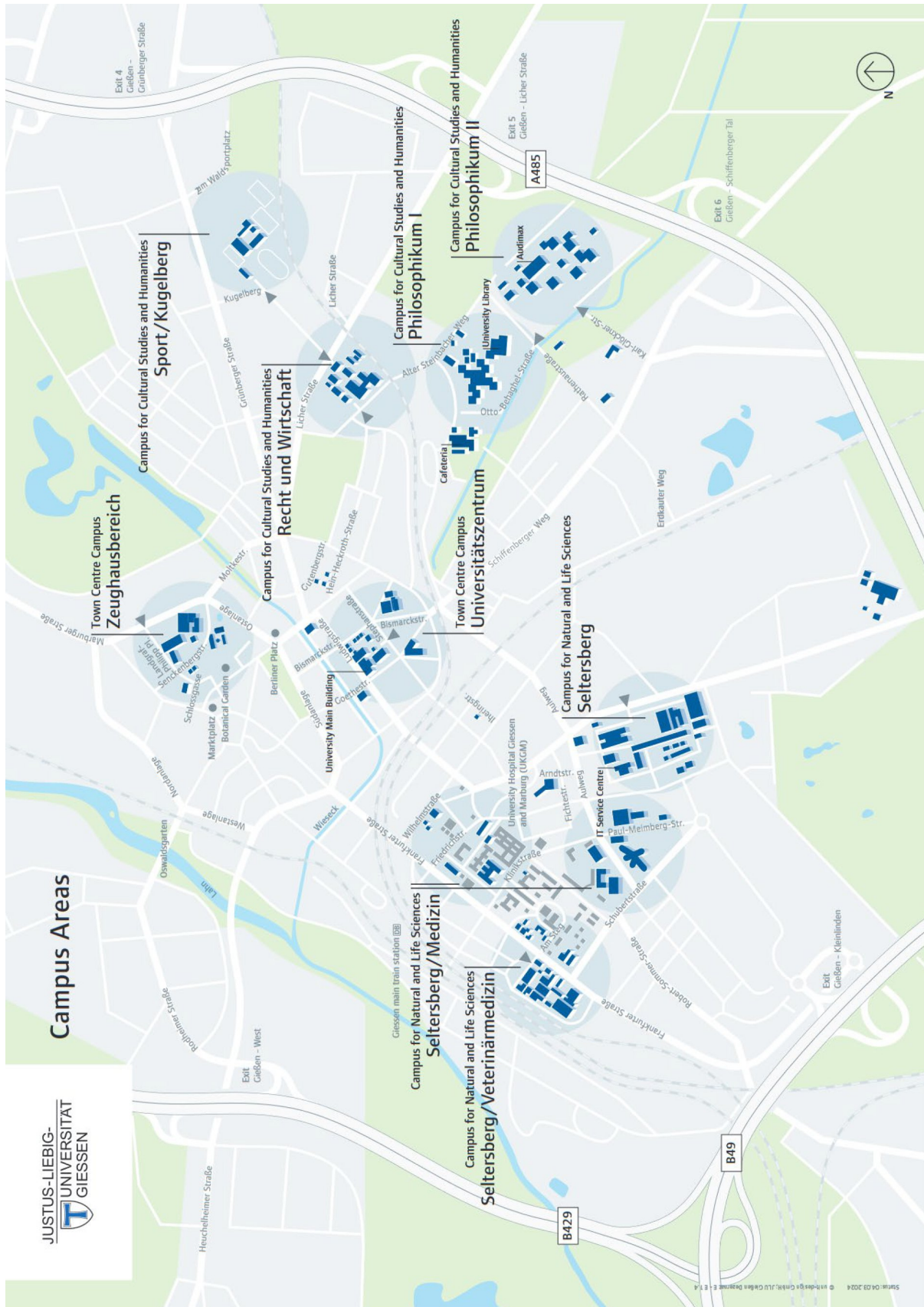
