Application Procedure	Exchange students should first contact the International Relations office at their home university. After being nominated, they will receive the required application documents by email. Accommodation	You can reserve a student room through the Association d'Entraide Universitaire (AEU), in charge of Student Residence Halls on the Lille Catholic University Campus (http://www.asso-aeu.fr/en/) as soon as you have been nominated. For the fall semester, we suggest reserving a room with the AEU <i>as soon as possible!</i> In France, a private owner can legally ask for a French guarantor if a foreign student is renting an apartment or a room.
Welcome Session	The International Student Welcome Session will take place the week before the academic semester starts. The goal of this week is to provide new students with an introduction to ESTICE International Business School and the Lille Catholic University as well as the city of Lille. This is when incoming students will choose their classes for the semester.
Mentor/Buddy Program	The incoming students are in contact with the International Group before their arrival and throughout the semester. A Buddy Program with students from different school years enables the international students to discover the local culture.

Health Insurance	European students must provide a copy of their European Social Security card. Non-European students are required to pay for the French Social Security . It reimburses 'ambulatory care' and hospital stays. The cost for Social Security coverage (for one semester or for the academic year) is around 215€.
