- 6. The ability to reflect upon their own religiousness in relation to their personal background and the academic-theological tradition, and with regard to their future professional role.
- 7. Confidence in their own assessment abilities and the use of these abilities in dealing with religious and philosophical forms of life and thinking within the theological, social and cultural sciences.
