1. ARRIVAL & ORIENTATION

1.1. Arrival in Giessen via the Frankfurt Airport (FRA)

Frankfurt Airport offers various connections to the city of Frankfurt via S-Bahn and regional trains (Frankfurt Airport Regional Station), as well as IC/EC/ICE long-distance trains (Frankfurt Airport Long-Distance Station). Travel to Frankfurt Central Station (Hauptbahnhof) from Frankfurt am Main Airport and then take one of the trains running at least hourly (RE, HLB or IC) to Giessen. The travel time is approximately 45 minutes.

The "Deutschlandticket", which you receive when you enroll at JLU, covers all local transport journeys throughout Germany.

Long-distance transport (IC/ICE/EC, and Flixtrain) is not included.

From Frankfurt am Main Central Station, you can reach Giessen with the following train lines:

1.2. Getting around in Giessen

Trains: Giessen is well connected to Europe's rail network. All European train connections to and from Giessen can be found in German, English, Italian, Spanish, Dutch, Danish, Polish and Turkish on www.bahn.de.

Busses: Giessen has a dense network of city bus routes. As Giessen is also part of the Rhine-Main Transport Association (RMV), you can also travel to Giessen by public transport from more distant locations such as Frankfurt or Wiesbaden.

1.4. The Semester Ticket (Deutschlandticket):

The [semester ticket](#) is a digital ticket and is included in the semester fee. After enrolment or re-enrolment, the semester ticket must be activated through the online portal : [Semesterticket – AStA JLU Giessen](#). You can log in with your HRZ account ID and will receive a QR code which you can save to the digital wallet on your smartphone. This allows offline use when you do not have an active internet connection.

With the Deutschlandticket, all public transport can be used nationwide, including buses, regional trains, trams and underground trains. **Important note:** long-distance transport (ICE, EC, IC) is excluded. Separate tickets must still be purchased for these.

Validity periods

Winter semester: October 1 – March 31

Summer semester: April 1 – September 30

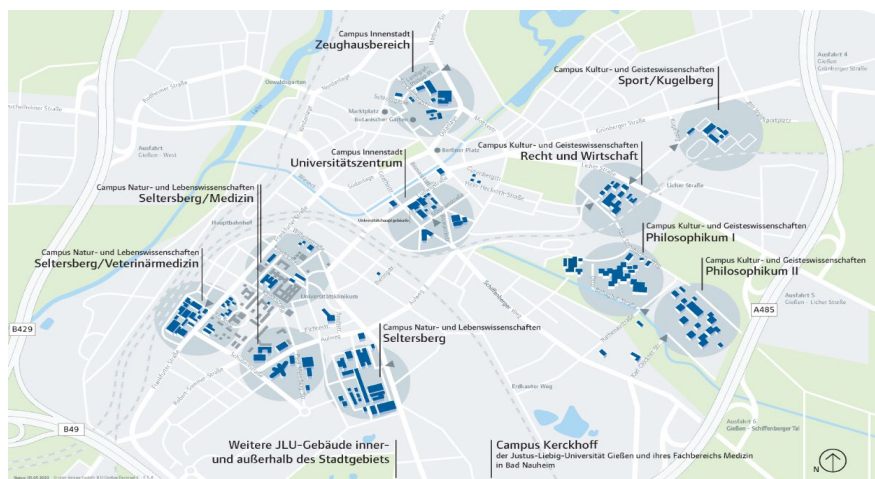

2. ADMINISTRATIVE ESSENTIALS

Starting life as an international student in a new country comes with a few important administrative steps. Completing these procedures early will help ensure your stay in Giessen is smooth, safe, and stress-free.

This section outlines the key tasks you need to take care of when you arrive, including registration, visa and residence requirements, health insurance, and banking.

2.1. Registration



YOUR START IN GIESSEN

Accommodations before Arriving in Germany

- Apply for an apartment or a shared flat (a WG-room) at the **Studierendenwerk Giessen** and search in parallel for accommodation from private landlords as the waiting times for a student room are long. Alternatively, look for private accommodation only.

Accommodations after Arriving in Germany

- Ask the landlord to sign the confirmation of tenancy (**Wohnungsgeberbestätigung**)!
- **Order your student card:** If you have registered and already activated your JLU-account, you will receive an e-mail with a request to upload your photo for the student ID as well as to confirm a shipping address. Your student ID will then be produced and sent to you by post. Please note that student cards cannot be sent abroad, so please provide a German shipping address. More information on the student ID can be found [here](#).

City Hall

- When living in Germany, you have to register with local authorities. Feel free to join the group appointment for registration during our Owis (2nd and 8th of April). You will need your ‚Wohnungsgeberbestätigung‘ and your passport. If you would like to register yourself, book a registration appointment (**Wohnungsanmeldung**) at the city hall (**Stadtbüro**) [via this link](#).

- If you do not live in Giessen, please register in the city where you live.
- You will receive your certificate of registration right away.
- After 7-10 working days, you will receive a letter with your personal 11-digit **tax identification number** [**Steuer-ID aka. Persönliche Identifikationsnummer**] --> keep it safe!

Bank

- If you do not already have a German bank account, do open one here at a German bank.
- Usually, you will need the following documents for **opening an account**: **certificate of registration, tax ID, passport/identity card**, and **residence permit** (if applicable).
- If you have a blocked account and would like to release the funds in it, you will need a confirmation from the Immigration Authorities (**Ausländerbehörde**).
- Some banks require you to book an appointment for the account opening. Check in with them beforehand!
- Bring your student ID in order to receive some benefits for opening a bank account, e.g. free account.

Immigration Authorities

- Contact the Immigration Authorities (Ausländerbehörde) via email **auslaenderbehoerde@giessen.de** or telephone **0641 306-2280** for your registration.
- The Immigration Authorities will send you more information on the required documents via post, or offer an appointment to you.
- If you do not live in Giessen, contact the Immigration Authorities in the city where you live.

2.2. Health Insurance

Health insurance is mandatory for all students in Germany. You must - regardless of whether you have statutory or private health insurance or an EHIC card - contact a statutory health insurance provider prior to enrolment in order to initiate a digital insurance notification, a so-called M10. There are different type of insurances:

Statutory health insurance in Germany: The monthly fee for all health insurances for students is approx. 130-150 € (incl. nursing care insurance coverage). We strongly recommend that you take out a German, statutory, student health insurance policy. For enrolment at JLU, please apply for a digital M10 certificate from a German statutory health insurance company of your choice.

Statutory health insurance within the EU (EHIC card, AT-11/social security agreement or equivalent): If you are already insured in another EU country, you can be exempted from the statutory insurance obligation in Germany. Please contact a German statutory health insurance provider of your choice and send them a scan of your EHIC card (front and back) for the digital M10 certificate. If you take up a part-time student job in Germany, you are automatically subject to compulsory insurance and require statutory health insurance in Germany.

Private health insurance in Germany: We strongly recommend that students under 30 take out statutory health insurance or at least seek advice before taking out private health insurance! Should you nevertheless decide to take out private health insurance and wish to be exempted from the statutory requirement, you must apply for an exemption from a statutory health insurance provider. To do so, please contact a German statutory health insurance provider of your choice, present the proof of private health insurance and apply there for a digital M10 certificate for enrolment at JLU.

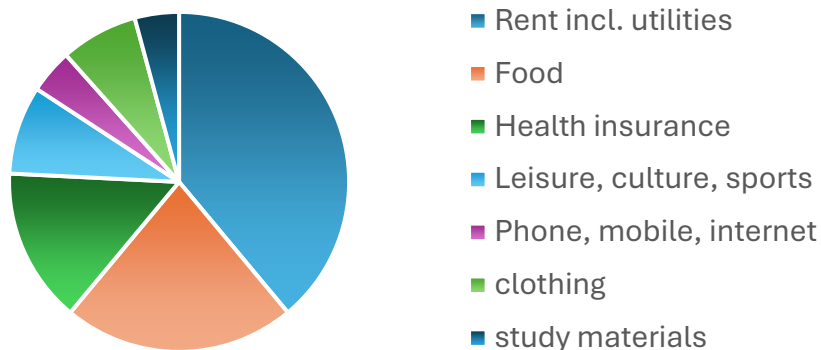

2.3. Costs and Financing

Currently, you have to expect costs of about € 1,000 per month in Germany. From the winter semester 2024/25 onwards the assumed annual standard requirement, which must be paid into the blocked account when applying for a visa, is € 11,904 (€ 992 per month).



Before enrolment, please take out a German statutory health insurance for students (approx. € 130-140 per month).

Please note that at JLU, we do not provide scholarships for the whole degree programme. Nonetheless, we usually offer financial support for international students in the final phase of their studies. Opening a bank account is essential for everyday life in Germany—for paying rent, receiving scholarships or part-time job salaries, and managing daily expenses. Tips for Students:

- Most supermarkets accept cash and cards, but some smaller stores prefer cash
- Most of the stores remain closed on Sundays.
- Don't forget to bring your own shopping bags. Many stores charge for plastic bags.
- [Weekly Farmers' Market](#): Fresh fruits, vegetables, bread, and regional products. Great for seasonal items. They mostly accept cash only.

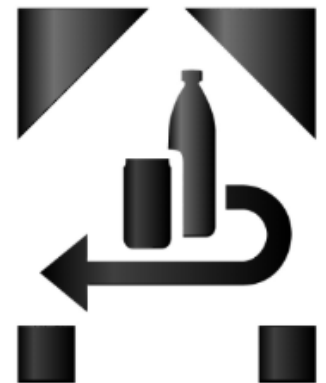
3.2. Understanding the “Pfandflaschen” System in Germany:

In Germany, many beverage bottles and cans come with a **deposit**, called a *Pfand*. This is a small fee you pay when you buy the drink usually between **8 and 25 cents** per bottle or can.

When you finish your drink, you **return the empty bottle or can** to a supermarket or a bottle return machine (*Pfandautomat*) and get your deposit back.

How to use the system:

- Look for the *Pfand* symbol on bottles and cans. If it has this, it's refundable.
- Keep your bottles and cans in good condition (don't crush them too much before returning).
- Most supermarkets have automatic machines that scan your bottles and give you a receipt. You can use this receipt to get cash at the checkout or reduce your shopping bill.
- Non-refundable bottles (like glass wine bottles or milk cartons) usually don't have a *Pfand*.
- Bottles you buy on campus can be returned at the cafeteria and canteens on campus as well.



3.3. SIM Cards & Internet Providers

Staying connected is essential for studies and daily life in Germany. International students usually rely on prepaid SIM cards or SIM card contracts for mobile data and calls, and home internet (DSL or fiber/Glasfaser) for their apartments.

SIM Cards (Prepaid)

Prepaid SIM cards are the easiest way to get connected without a long-term commitment. You can buy them in stores or online. You'll need your passport/ID, but no German bank account is required.

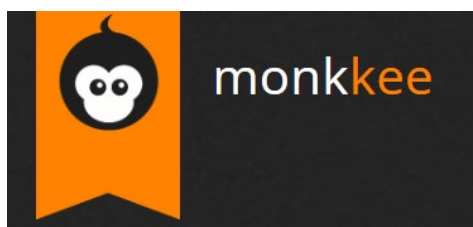

3.5. Waste Sorting

Waste sorting (Mülltrennung) is very important in Germany. Different types of waste must go into different bins. Sorting correctly helps recycling process.

Below is a simple guide to help you sort your waste correctly.

- Bulky waste (used furnitures etc.) is picked up on certain days by municipal administration.
- Electronics bins (Elektroschrott-Container) in Germany are specifically designated for used electronics and objects bearing the WEEE logo, indicating they fall under the Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment directive. These bins are typically located in electronics stores, hardware stores, and some supermarkets
- Special bins are used for used clothes and shoes.

Good To Know

Broadcasting service fee (GEZ):

The so-called Rundfunkbeitrag (broadcasting service fee) is a mandatory fee for the German state-funded radio and TV programmes. It has to be paid by every household even if you do not use radio or TV. The fee amounts to 18,36 Euros per month (as of January 2024).

If you share an apartment you can also share the broadcasting service fee. You or one of your flat mates must register with the ARD ZDF Deutschlandradio Beitragsservice. The non-paying members have to inform the agency that their fee has already been collected under the registered person's fee account number but they do not personally register!

Summer time / winter time

Summer time refers to the practice of changing clocks in order to make better use of natural daylight. Clocks are set 1 hour forward at the end of March, while at the end of October clocks are set 1 hour back to winter time.

Liability insurance

In Germany, it is common to have a liability insurance. If you are not insured with your parents, get informed about your options.

Electricity

Before using any electrical devices, please check voltage and plug / socket type.

Quiet Hours

From 10 PM to 6 AM, avoid loud music or vacuuming (*Ruhezeit*). Sunday is Ruhetag. Most shops are closed, and it's a quiet day for resting.



4. Your Student ID

The JLU student ID card is multifunctional and identifies you as a JLU student.

Valid:

- Winter semester: 1st of October to 31st of March
- Summer semester: 1st of April to 30th September

4.1. Cinema Flat Rate

The cinema flat rate gives you 1x voucher for a free cinema visit and 1x 10% voucher for the snack counters once a month. The vouchers are valid for 2D screenings at the [Kinocenter](#) and [Kinopolis](#) Giessen. However, 3D screenings, D-Box or premium seats can also be booked for an additional charge. The vouchers are not valid for special events, live broadcasts, film series or film nights.

You can redeem the vouchers either directly at the cinema box office or snack counter or in the online ticket shop. The vouchers expire at the end of the respective calendar month.

4.2. Rental Bikes

JLU has been facilitating the environmentally friendly mobility of students with a bike rental system and networking the various campus areas even better. There are now 360 rental bikes at 17 stations. All interested parties can use the rental bike system provided by the operator nextbike – you, as a student at JLU, can even get special conditions.

For you as a student there are no additional costs for the first 60 minutes of each rental. You can rent up to 3 bikes at the same time and thus be on the road with your friends at any time in an environmentally friendly way. After 60 free minutes a tariff of 1€ per 30 minutes and a maximum of 5€ per day applies. After a break of 15 minutes you can rent a new bike with free minutes.

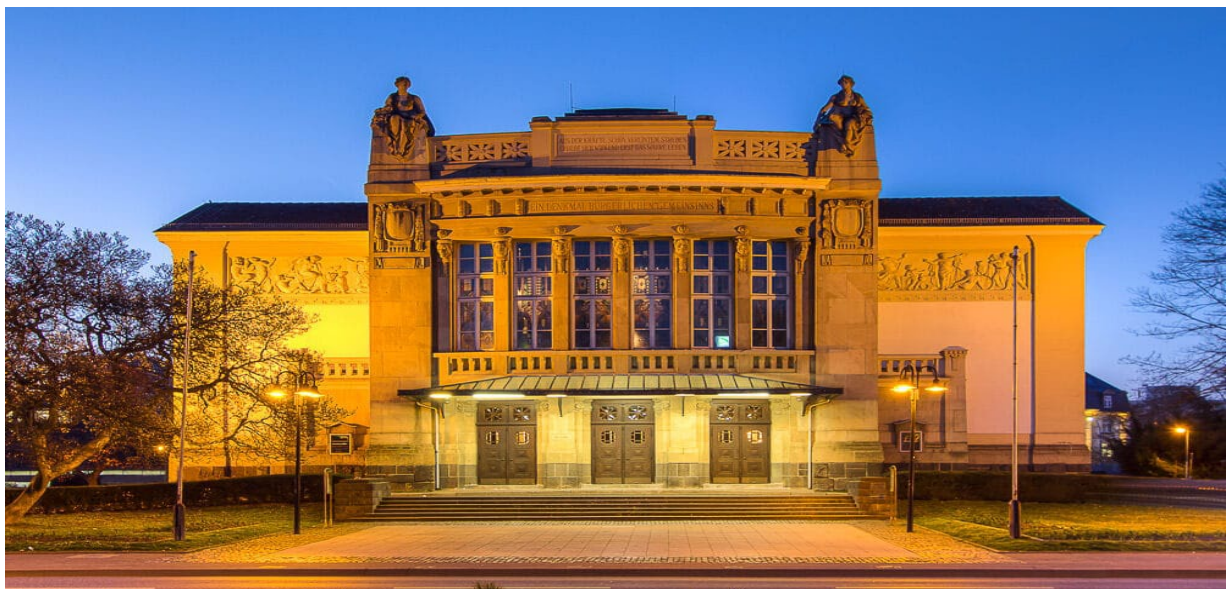

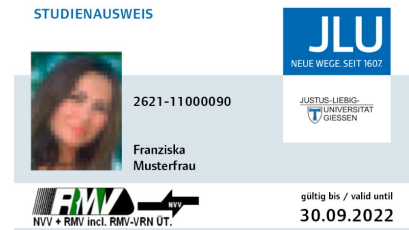

6. Paying

Go to the cashier and hold your student card to the card reader. The cost of your meal will be automatically deducted.

If you take a salad from the salad bar, it will be weighed at the cashier, and the price will be calculated accordingly.

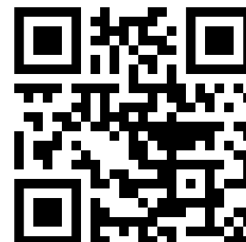
