Learning outcomes	The students are even able to analyze difficult phenomena of Latin syntax and complex text structures with the aid of appropriate descriptive categories. They have the linguistic ability to access demanding original Latin texts and to translate them appropriately into German. The students enhance their awareness of linguistic principles and their ability to evaluate and analyze translation methods.		
Module contents	In the language tutorial complex and structures of the Latin language that are particularly demanding from a German language perspective are systematically discussed and practiced. Grammar exercises and translations from German into Latin serve this purpose. In the reading tutorial the acquired knowledge is used to translate difficult original Latin texts and knowledge is therefore enhanced. Subjects covered in the reading tutorial are both demanding pieces of prose and poetic texts.

Interpretation includes not only stylistic features of the text but also its literary composition; the comprehension and evaluation of metric structures in poetic texts examined are also important.		
Module contents	The tutorial provides an overview of the stylistic characteristics of different Latin writers (the emphasis should be on prose). In contrast the reading tutorial concentrates on examples from a small selection of writers (the emphasis should be on poetry).
