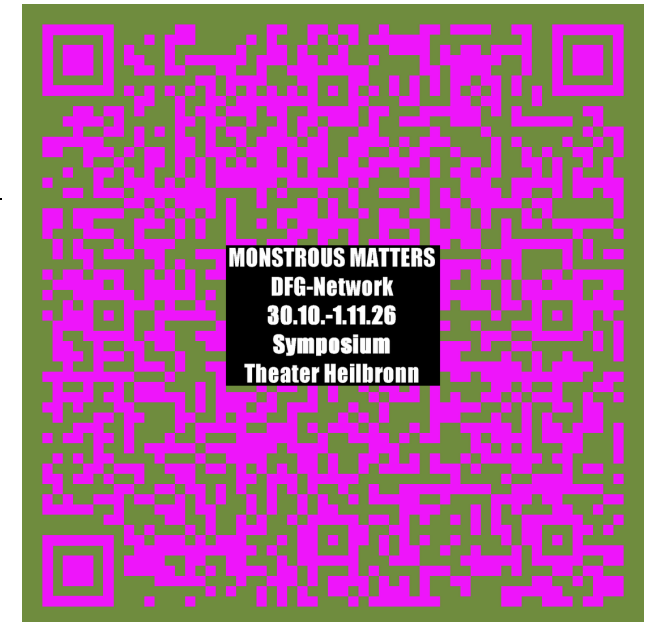

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From 30 October 2026 to 1 November 2026, the DFG-network [MONSTROUS MATTERS](#), in cooperation with [Theater Heilbronn](#), will host a three-day symposium featuring contributions that move between theory and practice. Alongside artistic guest performances by [Ocean Stefan](#) (MONSTER SHOW), [Xavier Le Roy](#) (Monster of Circumstances), and [Monster Mansion](#), the program will include scholarly contributions by Meriam Bousselmi, Michael Chemers (director of the [Center for Monster Studies at UCSC](#)), Jalondra Davis, Eva Döhne, Jose Nateras, Livia Andrea Piazza, Féline Rathke, Martina Ruhsam, Analola Santana, Marie Simons, Gerald Siegmund, Birgit Stammberger, Ekaterina Trachsel, Catherine Vrtis, and Andreas Wolfsteiner. Also joining the event are Mike Halekakis (podcast [THE SHOW WHERE THEY TALK ABOUT MONSTERS](#)) and Norbert Finzsch (author of Abjekte Körper). [VOLL:MILCH](#) will open a participatory, mobile monster archive station in [nota](#), and on Halloween there will be an afternoon program for children. At a networking aperitif, we will ceremonially announce the EUROPEAN CENTER FOR MONSTER STUDIES and celebrate together with a big Halloweenparty.

Hinweis zu Sprache und Vermittlung: Studierende aus der Angewandten Theaterwissenschaft an der JLU Gießen und der Goethe-Universität in Frankfurt am Main werden (dramaturgische) Rahmungen einiger der Veranstaltungen während der drei Tage in Heilbronn gestalten: Geplant sind Einführungen, Nachgespräche, Übersetzungs- und Zugangsmöglichkeiten und Begleit-Möglichkeiten (Monster Mentees), um dem Monströsen an diesem Wochenende in Heilbronn eine dramaturgische Rahmung zu geben, die möglichst zugänglich ist für möglichst viele Menschen. // **Note on language and mediation:** Students from Applied Theatre Studies at JLU Giessen and Goethe University Frankfurt am Main will design the (dramaturgical) framing of some of the events over the three days in Heilbronn. Planned elements include introductions, post-show discussions, translation and access options, and accompanying support formats (Monster Mentees) in order to provide the monstrous with a dramaturgical framework in Heilbronn that is as accessible as possible to as many people as possible.

MONSTER OF CIRCUMSTANCES – a Lecture Performance by Xavier Le Roy

Xavier Le Roy is one of the world's most influential conceptual choreographers. A trained molecular biologist, he has been creating works for stages and exhibition spaces since 1991 and has been professor at the Institute for Applied Theater Studies in Giessen since 2018. In *Monster of Circumstances* Le Roy explores how monsters come into being, how they escape from fantasy worlds and invade our daily lives to be among us and within us – and how they might help us overcome our fears. The versatile and disarmingly direct performer Le Roy succeeds, using simple means, in transforming the space together with the audience. As in many of his works that have become classics of performance art, he opens up a space of experience together with the audience, in which the principles of performance itself become visible and theory is conveyed sensually through the means of live performance.

Panel III: Epistemological traces of the monstrous in history

As Michel Foucault argues in „The Abnormal“, monsters do not just break the law but they suspend it, because the law is not applicable to their doings. The four contributions to this panel argue, therefore, that monsters appear at the faultlines not only of value but also of knowledge systems. Looking forward to what is to come, while not being able to let go of what was, they raise their incongruous heads in times of transition and change in which truths are suspended. The performative lectures in this panel will discuss various of these faultlines by addressing questions of teratology, gender, and the actor's body.

Ocean Stefan (they/them) makes work which runs across performance, installation, text and film. Their practice is one of inbetweenness and overlap, which celebrates liveness and slippage. They are interested in the grey areas in life, and their work is committed to undoing things which claim to be fixed.

Ocean is currently undertaking a PhD in posthuman performance, in the Centre For Research And Education In The Arts And Media (CREAM), at University of Westminster.

Norbert Finzsch (Prof. Dr. phil.), born in 1951, taught North American history at the University of Cologne until 2016. Since 2020, he has been a professor at Sigmund Freud Private University Berlin. In 2017, he received the Meyer-Struckmann Prize for his research on the history of the body. He is the author of „*Abjekte Körper: Zur Kulturgeschichte der Monstrositäten* – Die historischen Wurzeln der Transphobie: Ein Überblick über die Ablehnung von abjekten Körpern im globalen Westen seit 1500“.
